## **Infocouncil Now Supports 64 bit Office**

At long last we have completed the work required to enable Infocouncil to run in 64 bit Office. This is the culmination of thousands of hours of effort to migrate our code to Microsoft.NET. Included in this migration is our unique scripting language. This script is what makes Infocouncil so flexible and powerful and also what makes Microsoft Word behave itself when doing something diabolical like compiling a council agenda.

There are a few vestiges remaining to be migrated. These will be dealt with in the fullness of time.

Councils whose agenda compilation pushes 32 bit Word to its limits should give serious consideration to 64 bit Word and Infocouncil. The amount of working memory available to 64 bit Word is theoretically unlimited. In the 64 bit world you can compile an agenda of as many pages as you like with as many images as you like.

## **Objective ECM Integration Now Available**

We have completed the integration between Infocouncil and Objective ECM. The integration enables Infocouncil to:

The previous record was 26 councils. The new record is 30.</p> <p>The total number of councils using Infocouncil is now sitting at 182. Included in this are <u>all</u> of the newly amalgamated councils in Sydney and most of those in regional NSW.</p> <p>We are very grateful for the support.</p>  |
| <p><i>“We acknowledge the inevitability of the cloud and the imperative for Infocouncil to operate successfully in it”</i></p> | <p><b>Heads in the Cloud part 1</b></p> <p>We acknowledge the inevitability of the cloud and the imperative for Infocouncil to operate successfully in it. Essentially, what this means for us is operating in Word Online. If only it were that simple.</p> <p>First of all, let us state categorically that Word Online is at present a mere shadow of its desktop cousin. Many functions are removed from Word when you are in a browser. In 2015, for the first time, basic add-ins could be incorporated with Word Online. In 2016, Microsoft released the ability for an add-in to be able to customise the ribbon. At the same time they also released the ability for programmers to start to control some aspects of a Word document beyond just simple getting and setting text.</p> <p>Infocouncil is a Word add-In. It makes extensive use of the richness of functionality offered by the desktop version of Word. This is a blessing and a curse. It is a blessing because it is what has made Infocouncil what it is today; the undisputed leader in Australia and New Zealand for agenda management software. No competitor can match our ability to deliver the documents you want in the formats you want. It is a curse because Word Online is too far behind for us to simply make Infocouncil work, as is, with it.</p> <p>So we have to build a bridge between Word Online and Infocouncil. In time all Infocouncil functionality will be in the cloud, but there is too much work involved to take a big bang approach to this. Instead, we will do the work in stages. We will explain these stages over the next few issues of this newsletter. Up next some technical preliminaries and then report writing, report approval and managing actions.</p> |
